
District Missionary Brenda Gipson

Unfinished Business

Jesus said to them, “My food is to do the will of him who sent me and to accomplish his work.” John 4:34

Jesus provides a powerful insight into the essence of His purpose and mission in this verse. The phrase “My food is to do the will of him who sent me” reveals how deeply committed Jesus is to fulfilling God’s plan for humanity. Just as food sustains our physical bodies, Jesus indicates that His true sustenance comes from doing God’s work. This illustrates that Jesus prioritized His relationship with God and the calling He received.

In this context, “doing the will” implies not just knowing God’s intentions but actively participating in them. It reminds us that our spiritual nourishment is connected to obedience and alignment with God’s purposes. It challenges our understanding of what we consider necessary for our survival and success, shifting the focus from physical needs to spiritual fulfillment. We are encouraged to seek what God desires for our lives as a fundamental source of sustenance.

During Jesus’ encounter with the Samaritan woman at the well He speaks in context after His disciples return and offer Him food, but He expresses that His fulfillment comes from a different source. When He refers to “doing the will of him who sent me,” it emphasizes the divine mission entrusted to Him by God.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. What is the significance of Jesus’ interaction with the Samaritan woman at the well?
2. What do we learn from the testimony of the Samaritan woman?

From the testimony of the Samaritan woman, we learn several key lessons.

1. God’s love is inclusive: The Samaritan woman’s encounter with Jesus at the well demonstrates that God’s love is not limited to a particular group of people. Jesus reached out to her, despite the cultural and religious barriers that existed between Jews and Samaritans.
2. The power of personal testimony: The Samaritan woman’s willingness to share her encounter with Jesus led to the transformation of her community. Her testimony inspired others to seek out Jesus for themselves.
3. True worship transcends physical boundaries: Jesus teaches the Samaritan woman that true worship is not limited to a specific location or set of religious rituals. He reveals that true worshiper’s worship in spirit and truth, emphasizing the importance of sincerity and authenticity in our relationship with God.
4. The invitation to salvation is for all: Through the Samaritan woman, we see that no one is beyond the reach of God’s grace. She was offered the gift of living water, symbolizing the offer

Unfinished Business

Jesus said to them, “My food is to do the will of him who sent me and to accomplish his work.” John 4:34

In John chapter 4, we find Jesus sitting by a well in the region of Samaria. The scene is set in the middle of the day, with the sun shining brightly overhead. Jesus is weary from his journey and sits alone by the well, while his disciples have gone into the nearby town to buy food. The food that Jesus speaks of isn't limited to physical sustenance; rather, it speaks to a deeper need for a relationship with God and active participation in His works. Jesus calls us to prioritize our spiritual service over earthly distractions, inviting us to experience true fulfillment in His presence. This should inspire us to examine our own lives: what sustains us? Are we more focused on our physical needs or on fulfilling what God has called us to do?

When the disciples come back with food, they're surprised to find Jesus speaking with a woman in a private setting. Their cultural context viewed such interactions, especially with a Samaritan, as inappropriate. Yet, Jesus sees beyond societal norms. He uses this moment to teach His disciples valuable lessons about love, acceptance, and the transformative power of the Gospel.

The disciples, navigating their cultural biases, are focused on food while Jesus emphasizes spiritual sustenance. The contrast shows how often we can become preoccupied with worldly matters, neglecting to recognize the urgent work of God in our lives and the lives of others. This is the unfinished business we deal with.

John 4:34 serves as a clarion call for us not to lose sight of our spiritual priorities amidst the busyness of life. Like Jesus, we are invited to engage in a mission that transcends immediate physical needs and seeks the eternal impact of our actions.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. Why was Jesus' food unknown to His disciples?
2. What work of God the Father had Jesus been doing?
3. Why does Jesus call doing God's work His “food” (John 4:34)?
4. What is your attitude toward doing the unfinished work?

Unfinished Business

Jesus said to them, “My food is to do the will of him who sent me and to accomplish his work.” John 4:34

Jesus didn’t see His time on Earth as merely a series of obligations or tasks; instead, He viewed each moment as an opportunity to carry out God’s will. This mindset is something we can draw from, transforming how we approach our daily lives. It invites us to recognize God’s purpose in our endeavors.

When Jesus mentions the need to “accomplish/finish his work,” He alludes to the completion of His divine assignment, which ultimately culminates in His sacrificial death on the cross. He already knew the path ahead, the suffering and the glory that awaited Him. This acknowledgment serves as a reflection of His dedication and commitment to fulfilling God’s plan, reminding us of the importance of perseverance in our own spiritual journeys.

Analyzing the key parts of John 4:34 enhances our understanding of its depth. Let’s break it down: “My food is to do the will...” This statement highlights the priority of Jesus’ actions and thoughts—His deepest desire is to fulfill God’s will. Food is a basic human need, yet Jesus places the pursuit of God’s will at a higher level.

Jesus emphasizes the significance of spiritual nourishment and fulfilling the purpose for which we are created. We can find true fulfillment and satisfaction, even above our physical needs, by choosing to do God’s will and follow His plan for our lives. This shows us that our spiritual well-being is paramount and should take precedence over temporary desires or worries. Jesus says in Matthew 4:4, “Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God.” Similarly, in John 6:38, He states, “For I have come down from heaven not to do my will but to do the will of Him who sent me.” These verses collectively emphasize the centrality of divine purpose over earthly desires.

DISCUSSION QUESTION

Have you ever thought about what truly fulfills you? Reflecting on our priorities and whether they align with God’s will can lead us to a more meaningful and purpose-driven life. Jesus’s example challenges us to seek spiritual nourishment and prioritize our relationship with God above all else. We can experience a deeper sense of fulfillment and contentment that surpasses any temporary satisfaction from material things by doing so.

Unfinished Business

Jesus said to them, “My food is to do the will of him who sent me and to accomplish his work.” John 4:34

“...of him who sent me” signifies a relationship established between Jesus and God the Father. The term “sent” speaks of a mission, emphasizing that His purpose is rooted in obedience to the Father’s commands. Jesus embodies a model of what true servanthood looks like: responding to God’s calling without hesitation.

This verse serves as a poignant reminder of our spiritual calling in today’s fast-paced world, where material success and physical comfort often take precedence. It challenges us to reflect on our priorities and consider whether we are truly aligning our lives with God’s will. Are we focusing on temporary satisfaction, or are we committed to fulfilling a higher purpose?

The phrase “to do the will of Him who sent me” underscores obedience and purpose. It reminds us that our lives are not just our own; they are part of a divine mission. John 4:34 invites us to reassess our priorities and seek fulfillment in doing God’s work. We find deeper satisfaction and purpose by aligning ourselves with His will. This verse is a timeless reminder that spiritual nourishment far outweighs any physical need, encouraging us to live lives dedicated to a higher calling.

DISCUSSION

What is the will of God for my life?

Jesus said that His food was to do the will of the one who sent Him and to finish His work. God’s will for your life is to do the work He has called you to do and to fulfill the purpose He has for you. Therefore, you are also called to fulfill the specific tasks and assignments God has for you, being diligent and faithful in carrying them out.

Unfinished Business

Jesus said to them, "My food is to do the will of him who sent me and to accomplish his work." John 4:34

APPLICATION

All our labor is important. God uses men and women (sinful, forgiven men and women) to sow and reap. And we are always entering into the labor of another, especially Jesus'. His labor is always decisive. Especially the labor of the cross. This was his main food. *My food is to accomplish the work God gave me to do.* And with the cross in view, where he died for our sins, he said, "Father, I glorified you on earth, having accomplished the work that you gave me to do" (John 17:4).

You align yourself with His purpose for your life by focusing on doing God's will and completing the work He has for you. This may involve different tasks, relationships, or ministries that God has uniquely designed for you. Seeking His guidance through prayer, studying His word, and listening to the Holy Spirit will help you discern and walk in His will each day.

God's will is not always easy or comfortable, but it is ultimately for your best and for His glory. Trusting in His plan, staying obedient to His leading, and surrendering yourself to His purposes will bring fulfillment and peace as you live out the work He has prepared for you.

Imagine your life's work is a project with a deadline. John 4:34 tells us to prioritize God's task like it's our most urgent assignment. Dive into spreading His message with the same passion you have for your family and career. Don't wait; the time is now to serve others and share His love. Are you ready to commit to God's mission and impact those around you?

Where do you find the strength to continue your service to the Father? Clearly, some things in which we invest our time prove futile. Still others are worse than futile; they are depleting as well as useless. However, consciously doing what we do to honor the Father, to follow his will, enables us to experience his empowering presence (John 14:19-23).

Rather than leaving us depleted, we find a new strength and vitality in Him by accomplishing the will of God and doing the work he created us to do (cf. Eph. 2:10). This blesses us as we bless others. That's why Jesus would reprimand the evil one with the truth that God's word nourishes more than bread. So, we need to ask ourselves today, "What do I need to obey? What will help me live in God's will for my life today?" Then as we do that, we too can rejoice in the nourishing presence and power of heaven and complete the unfinished business.
